# ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND CRITERIA as per HPU/ GOVT NOTIFICATION

(B.A./ B.Com. 1st Year)

- The candidates seeking admission should apply online. The candidates will have to download prospectus and apply admission online on the college admission portal w.e.f 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2023 to 8<sup>th</sup> July, 2023. The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission in the prospectus before applying for admission.
- 2. Later on every student shall have to approach the admission /scrutiny committee for physical verification as perthe schedule notified by the college.
- 3. For the physical verification the students shall have to bring the following documents:
  - i. Downloaded Application form
  - ii. Fee slip
  - iii. Self-attested copy of all uploaded documents
  - iv. All original documents for verification

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

- (i) **Bachelor of Arts (B.A. Pass Course):** The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (includingEnglish) with 33% marks. However the students opting Mathematics as one of the subject of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
- (ii) **Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com. Pass Course):** The candidates with 40% marks in commerce stream or 45% marks in four written subjects including English at +2 level are eligible for admission to B.Com pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student to get admission in B.Com. is 33% marks in +2examination. However for admission to B.Com pass course the candidate must have passed **Mathematics/Economics** as compulsory subject at his/her +2 stage.

- (iii) All the admissions in B.A./ B.Com 1st Year will be made on the merit of the qualifying examination i.e. on the basis of percentage of marks of +2 examination. The student placed under compartment or failedin +2 examinations are not eligible for seeking admission.
- (iv) Age limit and relaxation: Admission is not granted to the student in 1st Year if he/she has attained the age of 23 years for boy students and 25 years for girl students on 1st July of the year concerned. The upper age limit will be raised by three years for students belonging to SC/ST categories. The Principal has discretion to provisionally grant age relaxation to the students of general category up to a maximum of six months subject to final approval by the Vice-Chancellor of H.P. University.

Note: All admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.

- Self-attested copy of the Matriculation Certificate.
- Self-attested copy of the 10+2 Certificate.
- Original copy of Character Certificate issued by the Head of School/College.
- SC/ST / OBC/ EWS Certificate duly issued by the First Class Magistrate.
- Affidavit to justify the gap year with Character Certificate issued by S.D.M./executive magistrate of areaconcerned and copy of Character Certificate from the Head of School/College last attended (Only for gap year students). Character Certificate issued other than the above will not be accepted.
- Single girl child will have to submit certificate from the competent authority i.e. Secretary
   Gram Panchayat, proof of her status as a single girl child.
- Himachal Bonafide Certificate.
- Certificate claiming IRDP / BPL/ WFF / Ex-Man/ WES / PH status (if applicable) issued by CompetentAuthority.
- Documents certifying achievements in sports and cultural activities.
- Applicants coming from Board/University other than the HP Board of School Education/HP University must provide Migration Certificate in original.

#### **Outlines of Choice Based Credit System:**

- 1. **Core Course** (14 for honours courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com): The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standard. Also the course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- 2. **Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

**Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course** (4 for honours courses and 2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

**Dissertation/Project\***: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course (4 for honours courses and 2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; i. Environmental Science and ii. English/Hindi/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

**Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)**: Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.

- 2. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)(minimum 2 for honours courses and 4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.
- **3. Practical/tutorials** (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practical from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Addition will however be of similar nature.

#### **Inclusion of Research Component in Under-Graduate Courses**

**4. Project work/Dissertation** is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

#### CREDIT SCHEME

- 1. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers.
- 2. An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
- 3. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism may be adopted:
  - i) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration
  - ii) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration
  - iii) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hour duration
- 4. For the introduction of AE Courses, they may be divided into two categories:
  - a) AE Compulsory Courses: The universities participating in CBCS system may have common curriculum for these papers. There may be one paper each in the 1<sup>st</sup> two years viz. (i) English/Hindi/MIL Communication, (ii) Environmental Science.
  - b) Skill Enhancement Courses: The universities may decide the papers they may want to offer from a common pool of papers decided by UGC or the universities may choose such papers themselves in addition to the list suggested by UGC. The universities may offer one paper per year for these courses.

- 5. The student will approach the respective admission committees to get his/ her form verified and subsequently it must be deposited with the member of the admission committee. Each candidate will get the receipt number for his/ her form.
- 6. Merit list will be displayed as per schedule mentioned in the prospectus.
- 7. The candidates in the merit list must contact their respective admission committees to collect their verified and duly signed admission form.
- 8. After getting the approved admission form, applicants are advised to deposit their fee at the fee counter as per the schedule.

- 8. A student seeking admission from Board/University other than H.P. will have to produce photocopy of his/her migration certificate.

- 10. Certificate of SC/ST from Magistrate Class-1 (Authorized Signatory) should provided by those seeking relaxation in age/marks.
- 11. Any gap (latest) in the academic career of the applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence / affidavit as proof of his/ her activities during the period of gap. If the gap is 3 year or more, the candidate will not be admitted

#### CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- 10. Students are not allowed to bring outsiders to the campus. Strict action will be taken against defaulters. Smoking, taking drugs/alcohol/chewing tobacco and spitting are not allowed in the campus. Strict action will be taken against defaulters.
