Report on Excursion to a Horticulture Farm---apple orchard for Hortipreneurship exposure

Date of Excursion: 13th may 2025

Location: Bhalsi Panchayat, village Hulka, Nirmand Horticulture Farm--SS Apple orchard

Organized By: Economics and Commerce Association (ECA) GC Nirmand

Participants: students as Members of Association, faculty commerce and History, Superintendent College and college Principal.

1. Introduction:


The excursion undertaken to extend the hortipreneurship exposure to the students . The primary objective of this visit was to provide participants with first hand exposure to the principles and practices of horticulture specifically the Apple growing encompassing the scientific way of growing apples , moving from tradional to modernize variety of apples ,management, and utilization of fruits alongwith looking for secondary cash crops like kidney beans ,garlic ,peas, vegetables etc. . This experiential learning opportunity aimed to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application, fostering a deeper understanding and looking for scope of entrepreneurship in the apple horticulture .

2. Objectives of the Excursion:

The key objectives of the excursion were to:

1. Observe and understand various apple cultivation practices employed in a real-world setting.
Identify different types of apple crops and their specific cultivation requirements.
- II. Gain insights into proper planting technique,nursery management, propagation techniques, and plant protection measures, irrigation techniques,fertilizations ,training and pruning ,pest and disease control for achieving high quality yields and maintaining the health of apple trees
- III. Learn about orchard management, post-harvest handling, storage, and marketing of apple produce.
- IV. Understand the role of horticulture in agriculture, economy, and environmental sustainability.
- V. Provide participants with an oppportunity to interact with horticultural experts and ask relevant questions.

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3. Description of the Horticulture Farm:


The apple orchard was spreaded in the area of 15 bighas with the variety of apple based on rootstocks like delicious galla ,m7 ,m9 . The plants were imported from Italy and few rootstocks were grown/grafted by the orchardist sh . Rajender Sharma. There were sections arranged for apple trees based on its life and variety supported with water storage mud and 500microns plastic supported tanks of 100 thousand ltrs and 60 thousands litres. Along with major apple crops the secondary crops like kidney beads,green vegetable, peas, garlis were also cultivates in vacant space between the distance of the trees .it was a unique cultivations.

Infrastructure and Facilities such as irrigation systems (drip), storage units, processing facilities, weed mats ,trained labors etc were well managed .Although soil Type and Climatic condition as per information of the orchardist was unfavorable (dry soil prevalent on the farm and the prevailing climatic conditions). But the determination, continuous practice and experiments through self learning influenced the apple cultivation practices and able to produce 4000 boxes (gift pack) average price rupees 2000. Per box.NNN

Management Practices: Briefly describe the overall management approach adopted by the farm, including aspects like organic farming, integrated pest management, or conventional methods.

4. Activities and Observations:

During the excursion, participants engaged in various activities and made several key observations, including questions round with the expert to know about the culture of healthy apple growing. During the Orchard Visit the Participants observed different propagation techniques such as seed sowing for secondary cash crops, grafting, pruning, thinning, budding, and layering. They also learned about the management of rootstocks, planting systems, pruning techniques, irrigation management, and fruit harvesting practices. They have observed different varieties and their specific characteristics. Participants observed the cultivation of various vegetables (e.g., tomatoes, leafy greens, root vegetables) and learned different planting methods, raised beds, mulching, and pest and disease management in crops.






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

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

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
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
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A report on Historical Tour to Lord Parshuram Temple



Today on 28-11-2024 History department of GDC Nirmand organized a one day departmental tour to Lord Parshuram Temple for study purpose. It was an educative tour to familiarize the student with art architecture, culture and rich traditions associated with this temple. This temple is located 2 KM from the College. So mode of travelling was on foot. The journey to this temple began at 10:30am from the college campus. At 11 am all students with their teacher were present in the temple premises. In this historical tour 38 students participated. All the students interacted with the priest community of the temple. During their interaction they raised some questions about the antiquity of the temple and its art, architecture and myths related to Lord Parshuram. Students are did photography and videography of the temple complex for further study on the sculpture, idols and architecture of the temple. They are supposed to submit a detailed report of their observations of the temple. From priest community of the temple Pt. Pushpender (Kardar) Sharma and Kushal (Chowkidar) interacted with the students and satisfied the queries and curiosity of students. At 3pm students came back to the college filled with new experience and knowledge of the temple visit.


