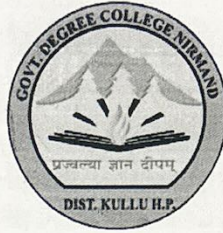

GREEN AUDIT REPORT

Govt. College Nirmand, District Kullu, H.P. 172023
Academic Session: 2024–25

1. Introduction

The Green Audit of Govt. College Nirmand for the academic session **2024–25** was conducted to evaluate the environmental practices, resource usage, and sustainability initiatives of the institution. The audit aims to promote eco-friendly practices, improve environmental performance, and encourage responsible behavior among staff and students.

The audit focuses on the following key areas:

- Energy Management
- Water Conservation
- Waste Management
- Green Campus Initiatives
- Biodiversity Conservation
- Environmental Awareness Programs

2. Objectives of the Green Audit

1. To assess the current environmental status of the campus.
2. To measure the consumption of energy, water, and other natural resources.
3. To review waste-management practices, including solid, liquid, and e-waste.
4. To evaluate the extent of green cover and biodiversity on campus.
5. To identify gaps and recommend sustainable solutions.
6. To promote a culture of environmental responsibility among campus stakeholders.

3. Methodology

The audit was conducted through:

- On-site inspection and observation
- Interaction with students, faculty, and non-teaching staff
- Inspection of classrooms, College Premises & office spaces
- Review of institutional records (electricity bills, water usage, purchase registers, etc.)
- Assessment of plantation and biodiversity in the campus vicinity

5. Audit Findings

5.1 Energy Management

- The campus uses **LED** lights, with approximately **100 %** LED coverage.
- Electricity consumption patterns show **stable** trends as compared to the previous year.
- Energy conservation practices such as switching off lights/fans, maintenance of wiring, and natural lighting are **fully** implemented.

Scope for Improvement:

- Adoption of solar energy.
- Awareness drives for optimal energy use.

5.2 Water Management

- The campus receives water from **HP Jal Shakti Dept & ~~mand~~**.
- Water consumption is **moderate**, with supply adequate for institutional needs.
- Drinking water units equipped with UV/RO filtration are functional.
- Rainwater harvesting structures **exists**.
- Regular monitoring of leakage and wastage is practiced.

Recommendations:

- Repair rainwater harvesting structures.
- Install sensor based taps to reduce wastage.
- Conduct awareness programmes on water conservation.
- Increase the water storage capacity.

5.3 Waste Management

a. Solid Waste

- Dry and wet waste segregation is **fully** implemented.
- Dustbins are placed at strategic points.
- Wet waste is disposed in pits

Recommendations:

- Strengthen waste segregation at the source.
- Start campus composting for biodegradable waste.
- Proper mechanism should be developed for the collection and disposal of E-waste.

5.4 Green Campus Initiatives

- The college has rich greenery with **80%** green cover.
- Regular plantation drives are conducted under NSS, NCC, Red Ribbon and Eco Club.
- Open spaces and lawns are maintained.
- The institute is proud to have green campus free from plastics.

Suggested Measures:

- Expand green cover by planting native species.

5.5 Biodiversity Status

- The campus supports a variety of **trees, shrubs & herbs**.
- No endangered flora or fauna reported.
- Open green areas function as small ecosystems conducive to campus biodiversity.

5.6 Environmental Awareness Programs

During the session 2024–25, the institution organised the following:

- Tree plantation drives
- Cleanliness campaigns under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan
- Lectures/seminars on environmental protection
- Celebrations of Environment Day, Ozone Day, etc.
- Student participation through NSS/ NCC/ECO Clubs was encouraging.

- Active student participation in eco-initiatives
- Adequate greenery and open spaces
- Availability of clean drinking water

7. Recommendations for Sustainable Development


1. Strengthen waste segregation, recycling, and composting practices.



- Most departments maintain teaching plans, attendance records, and internal assessment documentation.
- Student-centric teaching methods—including ICT-based teaching, group discussions, and field-based activities—are adopted though frequency varies across departments.

4.3 Internal Assessment

- IA is conducted per HPU regulations through assignments, tests, and class participation.
- Transparency is maintained by sharing marks with students.

- Faculties participate in orientation, refresher courses, FDPs, workshops, Research & its publication, seminars & Conferences.

- Departmental research activities such as student projects and field surveys are conducted in a few departments.

- Career Guidance and Counseling Cell is functional; however, regular tracking of student progression needs improvement.
- Scholarships and financial aid are effectively facilitated.

6.2 Co-curricular & Extracurricular Activities

- NSS, NCC, Sports, Cultural Committees, and Eco-Club Departmental societies & association etc. conduct regular activities.
- Students actively participate in college-level competitions and outreach programs.

6.3 Student Feedback

- Formal feedback is obtained from all the stakeholders i.e. students, Parents of the institution and analyzed, though follow-up actions need systematic documentation.

7. Infrastructure & Learning Resources

- Classrooms and library facilities are adequate.
- ICT facilities are improving, though additional smart classrooms and digital resources are recommended.
- Playground and sports facilities support student physical development.

8. Governance, Leadership & IQAC Functioning

- The Principal provides academic and administrative leadership.
- IQAC is active in coordinating quality initiatives, preparing AQARs, and organizing seminars/workshops.
- Committee structures (Academic, Examination, Purchase, Discipline, etc.) function effectively.

- Eco-friendly campus initiatives (plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns)

- Dedicated faculty committed to student welfare
- Disciplined student body and supportive community
- Growing use of ICT and blended learning
- Effective coordination between administration and faculty
- Good enrolment from rural and underserved areas

11. Areas of Improvement

- Need for more course for study.
- Enhancement of research culture and funded projects
- Expansion of ICT-enabled classrooms and high-speed internet
- Strengthening of departmental documentation and outcome-based education practices
- Increased industry exposure, internships, and skill-based training for students

12. Recommendations


1. Strengthen ICT-enabled teaching by establishing additional smart classrooms.

9. Need of Hostel to cater residential facilities to rural students.


13. Conclusion



I agree with the observations of the External Academic Audit Team as mentioned in this report.




