



Curriculum Relevance to Courses and Programme




The pie chart represents a survey where students of the college were asked if the contents of the

Curriculum According to Latest Standards




The second pie chart represents responses to the question about whether the contents of the curriculum are aligned with the latest standards. There are 72 responses in total, and here is a detailed breakdown:

Curriculum Size Appropriate for Annual System




The pie chart represents feedback from 72 students regarding whether the curriculum size is appropriate for the annual system. Here's an analysis of the chart:

Availability of Learning Resources




This pie chart shows the feedback of 72 students on whether learning resources (such as books, study materials, and online resources) are adequately provided and available. Here is a detailed analysis:

iii. Action on Feedback:

ACTION TAKEN REPORT

1. Curriculum Relevance to Courses and Programme Feedback Summary:

A large majority of students (93.1%) affirmed that the curriculum is relevant and aligned with programme outcomes.

Actions Taken:

- Faculty explained Course Outcomes (COs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), alongwith objectives, at the start of new academic session.
- Orientation sessions (under *Deeksharambh 2025-26*) were conducted to familiarize students with programme structure and relevance.
- Real-life examples, case studies, and contextual applications are integrated into teaching to relate curriculum to the objectives of both programmes and courses

2. Alignment with Latest Standards

Feedback Summary:

84.7% of students agreed that the curriculum reflects current academic and industry standards, though some were unsure.

Actions Taken:

- Teachers clarified updates introduced by the university and regulatory bodies since the introduction of CBCS.
- Contemporary topics and recent developments were incorporated into classroom discussions.
- Faculty attended academic trainings and workshops to stay updated with pedagogical practices (as can be seen in the [Annual reports](#) of the college)

3. Appropriateness of Curriculum Size for the Annual System**Feedback Summary:**

80.6% of students found the curriculum manageable, with a small group expressing concerns about workload.

Actions Taken:

- Remedial and tutorial classes supported students facing difficulty.
- Smaller, continuous assessments replaced larger assignments to reduce pressure.
- Additional revision classes were conducted before examinations.

4. Availability of Learning Resources**Feedback Summary:**

87.5% of students expressed satisfaction with available learning resources. Some requested more updated materials.

Actions Taken:

- The college has planned to strengthen with the library with new books and reference texts
- Teachers provided e-books, PDFs, and open-access resources through class groups.
- Faculty prepared topic-wise notes, summaries, and reading lists.
- Study materials were shared in advance to help students prepare effectively.

5. Encouragement of Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving**Feedback Summary:**

84.7% of students felt the curriculum promotes higher-order thinking, although some desired more structured activities.

Actions Taken:

- More Class discussions, debates, and analytical exercises in classrooms to be increased (as reflected in [Departmental Calendars](#))
- Students to undertake research-based assignments and presentations.



Eligibility for Admission	
1. Bachelor of Arts (BA) Pass Course: The students who have passed +2 examination at an examination equivalent to a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four science subjects (including English) with 30% marks. 2. Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) Pass Course: The candidates with 10th marks in minimum seven or 10% marks in four science subjects, including English at +2 level, are eligible for admission in B.Com pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student is get admission in B.Com in 20% marks in +2 examination. However, for admission in B.Com pass course the candidate must have passed Mathematics or Economics as compulsory subject at higher +2 stage. Note: 1. All the admissions in BA/ BCom 1 st Year will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination, that is, on the basis of percentage/marks in +2 examination. 2. The women placed under reservation in +2 examination are not eligible for seeking admission.	
Age Limit and Relaxation	
1. Admission is not granted to the student in 1 st Year if he/she has attained the age of 22 (in the case of boys and 25 in the case of girls) on 1 st July of the year concerned. 2. The upper age limit will be relaxed by three years for students belonging to SC/ST categories.	

3. The Principal has a discretion to provisionally grant age relaxation to the students of general category up to a maximum of six months subject to the final approval by the Vice-Chancellor of H.P. University.
General Instructions Related to the Admission Process for BA/ BCom 1st Year:
1. The candidates will have to download the college prospectus from the college website http://www.gdcnirmand.edu.in . The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission to the prospectus before applying for admission online. 2. The candidates seeking admission can apply online (through link available on college website) from 1 st June, 2024 to 10 th July, 2024. They will have to register themselves by making an account with a valid e-mail id on the admission portal available on the college website. Please note that there is no provision of filling up forms in an offline mode. 3. There will be Pre-Admission counselling for students seeking admission in the college from 2 nd June 2024 to 15 th June 2024 in the college campus. The students can clear their doubts related to BA and B.Com program and the admission procedure as well. 4. The subject wise merit list will be displayed on the college website on 18 th July 2024: http://www.gdcnirmand.edu.in 5. The students appearing in the merit list will have to deposit the prescribed fee online within the stipulated period as per the H.P.U. College website, that is from 18 th July to 19 th July 2024. The fee link for the online payment will get reflected on the account created by the student on the college admission portal. 6. After depositing the fee online, the students will have to appear before the admission committee for the post-admission counselling and the physical verification of documents on 22 nd July, 2024 in the college Campus. The students will have to bring the printout of the online admission form and other documents mentioned on Page No. 13 for the counselling and physical verification. 7. Provisionally admitted students (who have deposited the Fee and appeared for the post-admission counselling and physical verification) should note that it is compulsory for them (and their parents) to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year. Note: The date for submitting the anti-ragging affidavits will be notified by the college after the commencement of regular classes. 5. In the case of private: Original character certificate issued by the SEM of the university if necessary certificate from whether that the above will not be accepted. The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application.
6. In the case of passport, a copy of the passport with the date when it is available in Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus.
7. Financial Benefit Certificate for income (Income tax return or gift).
8. Original NCERT /CBC Certificate issued by competent authority (NCERT/CBC certificate only).

Admission to BA, B.Com 2nd & 3rd Year Along with Certificate

1. Admission to BA/B.Com 2nd year and 3rd year is on Roll on basis for which they have to apply through online mode only from 09th June 2024 to 19th July 2024. The students will have to download the college prospectus from the college website <https://www.gpu.acad.edu.in/>. They can fill the online admission form by logging into the account created in the admission portal available on the college website in the previous year. **Please note that there is no provision of filling up the form in any other mode.**
2. In the roll on system, the students who have studied in 1st and 2nd year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class, i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.

3. After filling up the online admission, the student should deposit the amount due within the stipulated period (09th June 2024 to 09th July 2024). The fee list will appear in the account created on the admission portal.
4. The students will also appear for the post-admission counselling and physical verification for the admission commencing in the college on 22nd July 2024. The students should bring the printout of the online admission application for the physical verification. 






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PTA EXECUTIVE MEETING

Report on Excursion to a Horticulture Farm---apple orchard for Hortipreneurship exposure

Date of Excursion: 13 th may 2025

Location: Bhalsi Panchayat, village Hulka, Nirmand Horticulture Farm--SS Apple orchard

Organized By: Economics and Commerce Association (ECA) GC Nirmand

Participants: students as Members of Association, faculty commerce and History, Superintendent College and college Principal.

Accompanying Faculty: Dr. Rajan Devi Negi (Assoc.Prof), Rahul Sharma (Asst.Prof), Surender Dhiman (Asst.Prof), Roshan Lal (Supdt.)

1.Introduction:

The excursion undertaken to extend the hortipreneurship exposure to the students. The primary objective of this visit was to provide participants with first hand exposure to the principles and practices of horticulture specifically the Apple growing encompassing the scientific way of growing apples , moving from traditional to modernize variety of apples ,management, and utilization of fruits along with looking for secondary cash crops like kidney Beans, garlic, peas, vegetables etc. This experiential learning opportunity aimed to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application, fostering a deeper understanding And looking for scope of entrepreneurship in the apple horticulture.

2.Objectives of the Excursion:

The key objectives of the excursion were to:

1. Observe and understand various apple cultivation practices employed in a real-world setting. Identify different types of apple crops and their specific cultivation requirements.
- II. Gain insights into proper planting technique, nursery management, propagation techniques, and plant protection measures, irrigation techniques, fertilizations ,training and pruning ,pest and disease control for achieving high quality yields and maintaining the health of apple trees
- III. Learn about orchard management, post-harvest handling, storage, and marketing of apple produce.

IV. Understand the role of horticulture in agriculture, economy, and environmental sustainability.

V. Provide participants with an opportunity to interact with horticultural experts and ask relevant questions.

3. Description of the Horticulture Farm:

The apple orchard was spreaded in the area of 15 bhigas with the variety of apple based on rootstocks like delicious galla ,m7 ,m9 . The plants were imported from Italy and few rootstocks were Grown/grafted by the orchardist sh. Rajender Sharma. There were sections arranged for apple trees based on its life and variety supported with water storage mud and 500microns plastic supported tanks of 100 thousand ltrs and 60 thousands litres. Along with major apple crops the secondary crops like kidney beads, green vegetable, peas, garlics were also cultivates in vacant space between the distance of the trees .it was a unique cultivations.

Infrastructure and Facilities such as irrigation systems (drip), storage units, processing facilities, weed mats ,trained labours etc were well managed .Although soil Type and Climatic condition as per information of the orchardist was unfavourable (dry soil prevalent on the farm and the prevailing climatic

conditions). But the determination, continuous practice and experiments through self learning influenced the apple cultivation practices and able to produce 4000 boxes (gift pack) average price rupees 2000. Per box.NNN

Management Practices: Briefly describe the overall management approach adopted by the farm, Including aspects like organic farming, integrated pest management, or conventional methods.

5. Activities and Observations:

During the excursion, participants engaged in various activities and made several key observations, Including questions round with the expert to know about the culture of healthy apple growing. During the Orchard Visit the Participants observed different propagation techniques such as seed sowing for Secondary cash crops, grafting, pruning, thinning, budding, and layering. They also learned about the management of rootstocks, planting systems, pruning techniques, irrigation management, and fruit Harvesting practices. They have observed different varieties and their specific characteristics. Participants observed the cultivation of various vegetables (e.g., tomatoes, leafy greens, root vegetables) and learned different planting methods, raised beds, mulching, and pest and disease management in crops.


